

How to Check the Status of your IT Account

The first thing to check if you're having IT issues!



As you progress through enrolment, the status of your account changes – as does your access to IT systems. If your status is anything other than in a C status you will not have full access and may encounter issues when trying to access some applications or services. You can check your status via the “My Status” tile in the KU mobile app. Any questions regarding your status should be directed to the Information Centre.

How to connect to the University's free wi-fi

Eduroam is a network connection for students and staff providing fast access to secure online University resources and the internet. When connecting you will need to enter your K number followed by the Kingston domain (K1234567@kingston.ac.uk) and then your network password.

Setting up Multi Factor Authentication (MFA)

Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA) is an enhanced approach to securing access to digital services, requiring more than a simple username and password as proof of identity. You will need to set up an authentication method to access many of the University applications and services, to do this you need to go to:

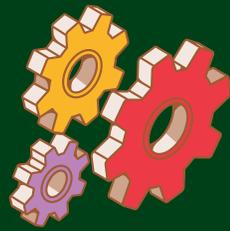
The greatest risk to security on the University network is the behaviour of individuals, including the sharing of passwords, responding to 'phishing' emails or introducing viruses from unprotected devices. We are all individually responsible for behaving in a manner that minimises the risk of service disruption or reputational damage, and the following is just a short list of things you should consider when going about your daily routine:

1. Your University network user name and password are yours and must never be shared.
2. You should always keep your portable devices, such as laptops, tablets and smart phones updated with the latest anti-virus protection.
3. Always report suspicious behaviour to

Password Support

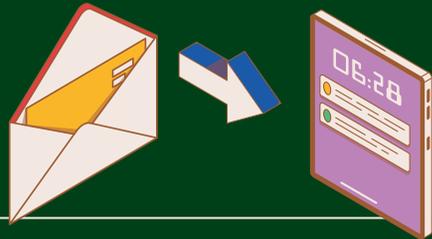
In case you're having issues with your password
